BEHAVIORS

Administration and staff are seeing an increase in undesired behaviors being displayed amongst middle school students, high school students, and even some parents. There are some destructive behaviors

that just will not be tolerated by MHA and will be turned over to the Muskegon Heights Police Department. Behaviors that will not be tolerated include but are not limited to:

- Bringing ANY weapons into the building (guns, knives, instruments that can be used as a weapon, mase, pepper spray, etc.)
- Fighting
- Repeated threats to do physical harm to others
- Physically assaulting staff directly or indirectly
- Parents trespassing to physically assault students or staff
- Students recording incidents of violence on campus
- Students sharing videos of assault or sexual activity
- Any other behavior as deemed grossly inappropriate or illegal

Any students or parents found in violation of any of the above mentioned infractions will be referred to the local authorities and MHA will give full participation in following through with the consequences outlined by the police.

New Paradigm for Education Instructional Priorities



Priority #1: Integrate reading, writing and discussion in all content areas to provide cohesive instruction and opportunities for productive struggle.

Priority #2: Provide effective feedback to students that affirms what they have done well and guides them toward academic improvement and achievement of learning goals.

Priority #3: Study and leverage student-level data on a regular and consistent basis to identify learning opportunities and create plans to address them.

Priority #4: Use rubrics as tools to provide a shared language with clear guidelines and expectations to provide a measure, adjust and evaluate learning.
