Martin Luther King, Jr.

Martin Luther King, Jr. was born in Georgia in 1929. At that time, whites and people of color were **segregated**. Martin's father taught him to always demand respect.

Martin was a great speaker and very smart. He won a big speech contest in high school. He was 15 years old when he finished high school in 1944. He went to Morehouse College in Atlanta, Georgia.

In 1948, Martin became a minister. He worked very hard to change segregation laws by giving speeches and leading marches. He told people not to fight and explained ways to change the laws in peaceful ways.

Sometimes, Martin went to jail for his ideas. Despite any consequences from his speeches, he never gave up. In 1963, he gave his famous speech, "I Have a Dream" in Washington D.C. In 1964, he won the Nobel Peace Prize.

In 1964, the **Civil Rights** Act became law. People of color had equal rights. Martin had great influence.

In 1968, Martin was killed.



Civil Rights: The rights that all people have to freedom and to be treated equally.


Segregated: Divided or separated by skin color.

Minister: The leader of a Christian church group.






